Choice of text style is NOT consistent from paragraph to paragraph.	Slides have a few minor errors but don't distract from understanding of the content.	Presenter's voice is clear. He/she pronounces most words correctly. Most audience members can hear the presentation.
2	Some information is logically sequenced. Answered only about 50% of the questions.	All graphics are attractive but a few do not seem to support the theme/content of the slides.	Font type and Color does somewhat distract from text or other graphics.	Slides have frequent grammatical, and begin to distract from understanding of the content.	Presenter's voice is low. He/she incorrectly pronounces terms. Audience members have difficulty hearing presentations.
1	There is no clear plan for the organization of information. Only one or fewer questions were answered.	Several graphics are unattractive AND detract from the content of the slides.	Font type and Color does distract from text or other graphics. Choice of text style makes the content confusing and difficult to read.	Google Slides have constant errors and are making the slides confusing and incoherence.	Presenter mumbles, incorrectly pronounces terms, and speaks too quietly for a majority of students to hear.
